Concentris Systems' Wireless-Embedded Platform Logistics System (W-EPLS) was approved by both the Hawaii Technology Development Venture (HTDV) and the Office of Naval Research (ONR) for display at the February 1 – February 11, 2010 Cobra Gold Exercises.

W-EPLS is being developed for U.S. Marine Corps Systems Command to automate the collection and sharing of vehicle diagnostic and prognostic information. Currently approved for Phase II development, the system will wirelessly network multiples EPLS-equipped vehicles across mobile convoys.
